

MARCH 2016

- Meeting called to order by President Dave Kolnes (Members in attendance: 17)
- January Club Meeting minutes read and approved.
- Treasury report read and approved.

OLD BUSINESS

- Dave discussed this year's raffle. In past years, the majority of the tickets were purchased by club members. This year, we will have a Remington 870 Express shotgun as the main prize in an effort to sell more tickets. Other prizes include: Real Flight 7.5 Flight Simulator, \$100 Gift Certificate to Scheels, \$50 Gift Certificate to Scheels, and a couple gift certificates to local restaurants. Dave stressed club participation in the success of ticket sales. A motion was made to spend \$800 on the mall rental, shotgun and Real Flight simulator. All members in attendance voted in favor.
- Members were reminded that 2016 club dues are due.
- Dave discussed the club's Facebook page and website.
- Jackets and Shirts are available for purchase with the club's logo on them. Jackets are \$55 and shirts ranging between \$15-\$30.

- Dave addressed the requirement to register with the FAA. Registration numbers must be placed on the aircraft in an area that does not require tools to access. An app is available on android and apple devices.

NEW BUSINESS

- Shawn E. discussed the success of the Bismarck Flurry Fly and AMA District meeting held in Bismarck on 27 Feb. AMA was promoting education heavily and addressed FAA registration. The AMA stated that while members are encouraged to register with the FAA, the AMA will not be regulating registration.
- Rich P. presented the club with internet service options. The club voted and agreed to drop the phone service and go with SRT's mid-grade internet service.
- Dave informed club members that the opportunity of getting public water was available to the club. Currently there is a project that will be running a water main past MAM Flying Field. For \$2,200.00 the club could T-off of the main. Russ G. would be able to run water on the property and have a water meter installed. This would be the last step needed to make the club self-sufficient. A motion was made to spend \$2,200 and take advantage of this opportunity. Motion carried. Attending members voted unanimously in favor of getting running water at the flying field.
- Raffle tickets were passed out to club members. The goal of this year's raffle is to raise enough money to pay for the water project and increase club funds.
